Budget

Prague is a relatively affordable city, but it's still important to plan your budget carefully. Make sure you have enough money to cover your expenses for the entire program, including food, transportation, and any activities you plan to do.

Eating out

- It is advisable to bring approximately 100 EUR in cash to cover any expenses. Upon arrival, it is essential to exchange the currency to Czech koruna (CZK) since the country does **not use euros**.

09 What To pack

- In order to make the most of your summer program in Prague, there are certain items that you should bring with you.
- It is important to bring your laptop as this will be your main tool for the lectures and you may need it during your internship as well.
- Bring some semi-formal clothes as there will be formal events during the program and you may need to dress appropriately for your internship as well.





10 Things To avoid



When it comes to transportation, it is recommended that you do not stop a taxi directly on the street. Prague has a reputation for overcharging tourists, so it is best to use a recommended taxi operator.

When exchanging currency, it is best to only use exchange offices or banks that are recommended by our staff. Avoid small shops and especially those in tourist areas, as they often offer poor exchange rates.





It is recommended that you do not carry your passport with you every day, but instead, bring a photocopy or your ID card if you have one.

02	Be open to learning and constructive criticism.
03	Be punctual and appropriately dressed for each working day, and to inform your supervisor if you are unable to attend due to illness.
04	Maintain confidentiality of sensitive information.
05	Complete assigned tasks to the best of your abilities and ask for help if needed.
06	Respect the property and equipment of the host company.
07	Respect the policies and procedures of the host company.
